Pupil premium students at Hawkley Hall considerably outperform pupil premium students nationally. The 5A*-C figure is 24% higher and when comparing to non-pupil premium students nationally this gap has now closed to -3.5%. Expected progress in English and mathematics for pupil premium students at

Hawkley Hall is considerably higher than national figures for pupil premium students and they are now outperforming non-pupil premium students nationally.
