  - Have little knowledge of different topics
  - Use little vocabulary / connectives
  - Use simple opinions
  - Evidence of only one tense present tense
  - Very short answers with lots of major errors, message is difficult to understand
  - No spontaneity and only very short pre learnt answers

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- Serious pronunciation errors, message is difficult to understand
- No fluency with lots of hesitation
- Highly inaccurate, both major and minor occur more and more frequently.

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
