Dear Parent/Carer

As we reach the end of the school year, I just wanted you share some key information with you and reflect on the year. The latest edition of the Hawkeye will be sent to you tomorrow morning and it reflects a snapshot of the many events and activities that have taken place during this term. It also reflects the achievements of individuals and groups of students. I also think it exemplifies the effort our staff put in to provide a broad and rich experience, inside and outside the classroom. I am also grateful to all of the parents who have contacted us in recent weeks to thank staff for their efforts. It is appreciated.

Hawkley Values

As you know, the Hawkley Way is very important to our school. As I stated in my recent letter, the core values that underpin any organisation are vital as a guidance system for everyone in the community. This summer term I have asked staff, students, and parents to reflect on this. The alignment between those values highlighted by all three groups was extremely interesting. All three emphasised respect, kindness, and honesty from the broader list. I am especially grateful to the student ambassadors who articulated their reasons for their choices. Next term we will be spending significant time discussing and teaching these values with all our young people and staff. They also align directly width the values of the Rowan Learning Trust.

Adjustments to session times during the school day

From September we will be adopting the new format of the school day trialled over the last three weeks. The response from staff and students has been overwhelmingly positive. Students have highlighted that they have particularly liked a shorter afternoon session and having a little more time during the first food break. In September, as the new food company takes over, we will endeavour to provide an even broader range of food during both food breaks as well as before school for breakfast (free porridge available to all!).

Building work and renovations

As you are aware, during the academic year we undertook a significant project as we redeveloped H Block. This has now been completed and it has been amazing to see the students and staff working in the new workshops. The final piece of this work is the Construction outdoor canopy. This will hopefully be completed in the autumn. We have also redeveloped learning spaces, invested in new doors around the site and refurbished the lighting for the MUGA. In the summer, we are carrying out major work on A Block. The atrium will be fully replaced providing better natural light. We are also re-surfacing the netball courts, decorating in several blocks, and replenishing and updating IT services. We are also hoping to open a gym for students and staff during next term I hope to give you more information on this in September.

B Block

As you may be aware, the Rowan Learning Trust began at Hawkley in 2012 under the leadership of Roy Halford. Over the last 11 years the Trust has grown. Throughout that time its core team has always been based at HHHS and for the last 5 years has been based in the Training Suite (B Block). As the staff within the Trust has grown, they require more space, so they are moving to new premises in the local area. From September we will regain the building. This will allow us to implement a behaviour hub to support our learners, carry out mentoring and continue to provide a suitable environment to support young people that require additional interventions.

Expectations – Uniform and Equipment

In September we will be extremely focused on ensuring we get off to a good start to the new academic year. I cannot emphasise enough how a correct uniform, appearance and equipment helps ensure we can focus on learning and supporting our young people. Whilst the overwhelming our students always conform to our expectations, supported by families, we continue to deal with a small number of issues daily. This takes away valuable learning time for the students in question. When we return, I would appreciate your support in ensuring your child conforms to our expectations.

Please ensure that you read our policies carefully and ensure that your child returns to school with the correct equipment of a school bag, basic equipment and has the correct uniform. If they do not, it will be challenged, and parents contacted. It is a parental responsibility to work with the school to ensure that these expectations are applied.

As I regularly emphasise, we have recycled significant amounts of uniform in the last two years. If you have uniform that your child no longer needs that is still fit for use, please give it to us and we will wash and

repurpose it. If you require support with the purchase of uniform, please contact us <u>s.lord@hhhs.net</u>. We will have a recycling box in reception until the middle of August. During the next academic year, we will be conducting a review of uniform and we will consult with students and yourself about any potential changes.

Arbor Information Management System

In the new academic year school will be moving to a new communication system. The new system is called Arbor and will allow us to bring all our current systems of payments and communication into one log in. This will make it significantly easier for parents with just one log in. There will be more information to follow in the new academic year.

3 Peaks Challenge
