# Year 9 Options



## Compulsory Subjects

Subject	Qualification
English Language and Literature	GCSE (2 certificates)
Science (Trilogy or Separate)	GCSE (2 or 3 certificates)
Mathematics	GCSE (1 certificate)
Physical Education	None

Compulsory subjects account for just over 3/5<sup>th</sup> of the curriculum (16 lessons)

The remaining 9 lessons are for Option Subjects





# Year 9 Options



## E-Bacc or not?

The E-Bacc (English Baccalaureate) is a recognition of a good pass at GCSE, which means gaining a grade 5 or higher in the following subjects:

- English (Language and Literature) (Compulsory)
- Mathematics (Compulsory)
- Science (Trilogy or Separate) (Compulsory)
- A Language (Spanish), History or Geography (or Computer Science)



What does it mean? *Respect, Honesty, Kindness*

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# Year 9 Options



- It is not an “extra” qualification, just a recognition of grade “5” or better in all those subjects – however students need to study one as an option)
- No local Further Education colleges or 6<sup>th</sup> forms require it for entry to their courses
- No Higher Education universities state it in their entry requirements (see Russell Group “Informed Choices” document)

**Our advice therefore is to pick the subjects which give you the best chance of the best grades**

Art: Textiles

Physical Education (GCSE PE or Vocational Sports Studies)  
Vocational Engineering Manufacture or Construction

- Vocational subjects are good choices for some, but not all students and this will be discussed with your child.
- At the beginning of Year 10 students will start their studies in science. Throughout the course their progress is carefully monitored to ensure they are gaining the necessary disciplinary and procedural knowledge. This data is then used to determine whether students are entered for the Trilogy Science or Separate Science GCSEs.





# Year 9 Options



## *Ineligible Combinations*

- Art and Design and Textiles **cannot** be chosen together.
- If you opt for PE, the PE faculty will make the decision as to whether you are best suited for GCSE PE or Vocational Cambridge National Sport Studies
- If you opt for Vocational Engineering Manufacture or Construction the Technology faculty will make the decision as to whether you are best suited for Engineering Manufacture or Construction





# Grade 9 to Grade 1 GCSEs and Vocational Grades

As a guide the numbers are broadly equal to the old grades shown below:

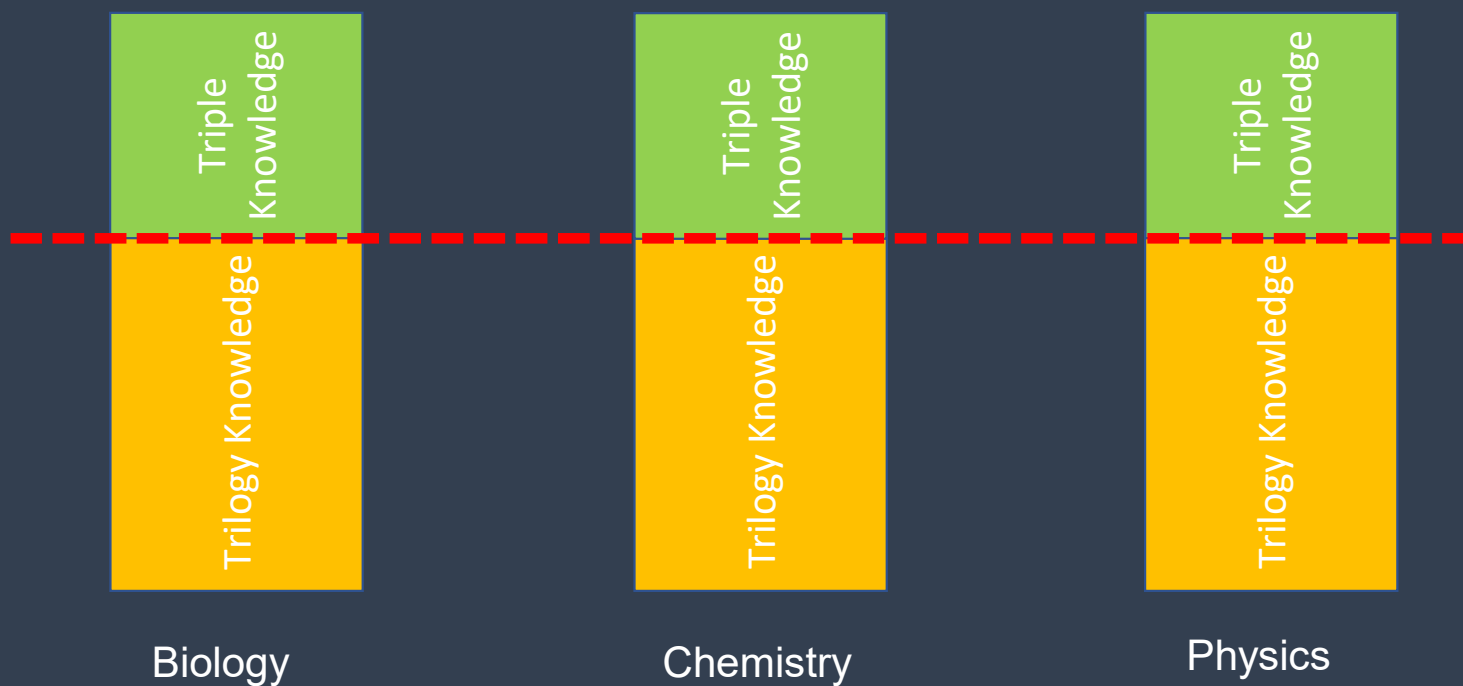




# Science: Trilogy vs Separate

- Separate Sciences (Triple)
- Trilogy Award Science (Double)

Both courses include the study of Biology, Physics and Chemistry







# Advice for Students



1. **Choose subjects they are likely to do best in.** Use the information from reports and the feedback from teachers as guidance
2. **Don't make a choice just because they like the teacher.** That teacher may well not be taking the group students end up in
3. **Be realistic** about strengths and weaknesses and accept advice about the type of courses on offer.
4. **Complete research** by reading the options booklet thoroughly and talking to teachers
5. **Above all don't choose a subject because friends are doing it!** There is no guarantee they will end up in the same class!





# Guidance



We will guide students to courses which we know will offer the very best chances of achieving the best grades.

Vocational options offer the best progression routes for some students. However, they are less suitable for others.

The options interview, if required, will be an opportunity to discuss the best combination of subjects for your child to get the best possible outcomes.

Our KS3 curriculum is not capped. Once a student masters a skill, they consolidate it and move on to another. If a student works hard, they can make faster progress and improve their chances of a better GCSE grade.

Year 9 have come to an important point in their education as they now must make their choices about which subjects to study during their final two years of High School in Key Stage 4.

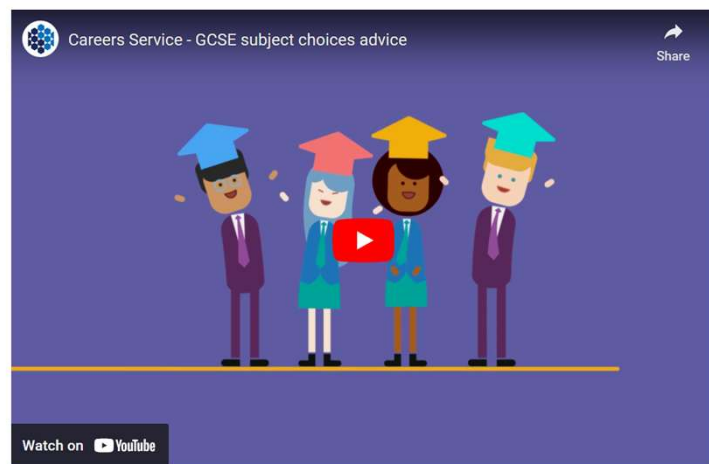

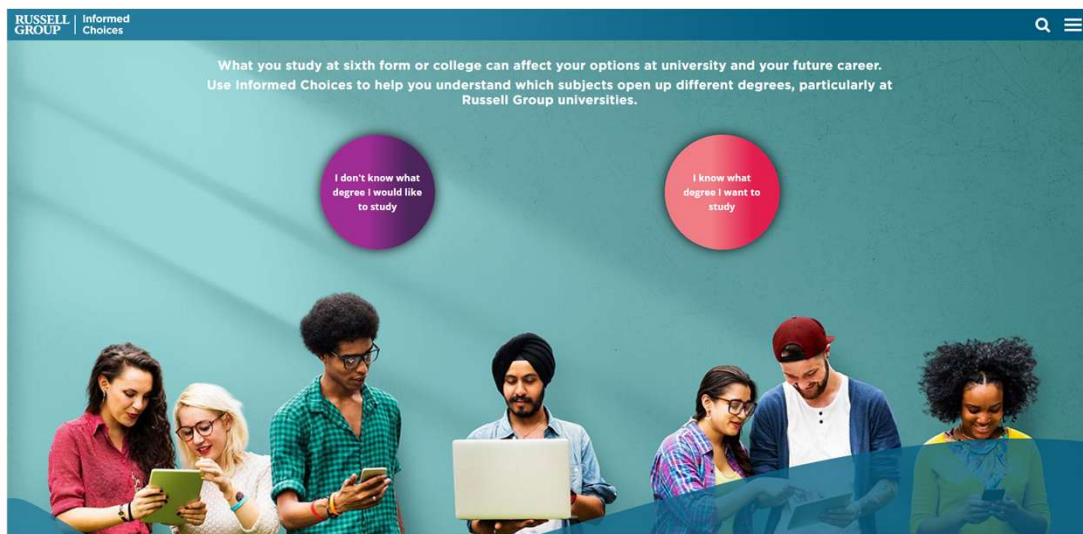

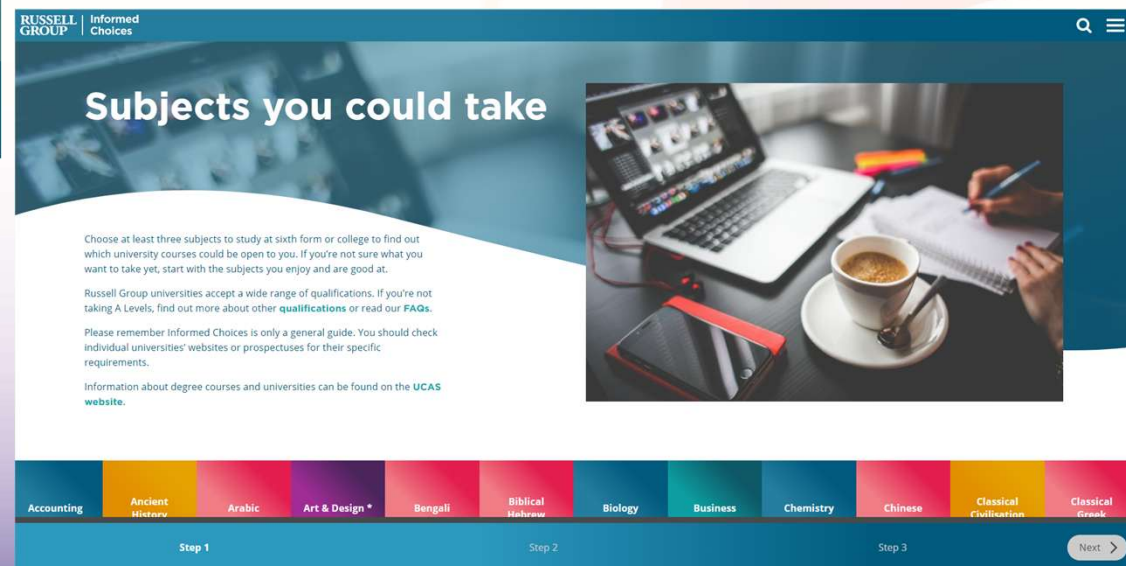
# Support: Informed Choices

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# Attendance Matters



Research shows that attendance at school has a significant impact on students' chances of achieving five good GCSE Grades:

If attendance is 95.1% to 100%...

HIGHLY LIKELY TO ACHIEVE  
WELL



If attendance is 90.1% to 95%...

QUITE LIKELY TO ACHIEVE  
WELL



If attendance is less than 90%...

NOT VERY LIKELY TO  
ACHIEVE WELL







# Attendance Matters



Five or more GCSE grades at grade 4 or above can increase potential wages by 41%.

Nationally students with 91% attendance or less will drop at least **ONE GCSE** grade.

Now think about this!  
Taking just 10 days holiday in term time means that your **MAXIMUM** attendance can only be 95%

And this!  
Taking a day off every couple of weeks means that your **MAXIMUM** attendance can only be 90%





# Key Dates



- Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> January and Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> February– options interviews take place if required
- Options form deadline Friday 6<sup>th</sup> February
- Monday 9<sup>th</sup> February onwards – option groups are generated
- Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> February onwards - Year 10 options start to feed into the school timetable for next year
- The vast majority of students will study their initial choices
- It is likely that a small number will have to be interviewed again and choose a different combination due to timetable clashes. Families and students will be contacted if this is the case.
