8 th May 2026	<p>Good Afternoon</p> <p>I am writing to inform you that squishy toys are not permitted in school. Some of these toys contain latex, which we do not allow in school as we have some students with a latex allergy. Squishy toys are also often popped by students and the inside makes a mess in our school. Although they may appear harmless, there have also been several national safety warnings highlighting concerns about the materials used in some squishy toys.</p> <p>An article has been recently published on the BBC about the dangers they pose https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/articles/c62d4pqjqrlo?app-referrer=deep-link</p> <p>Due to these risks, we must prioritise the safety and wellbeing of all students. Any squishy toy brought into school will be confiscated and disposed of immediately. Unfortunately, we are unable to store these items due to the mess they can make and the allergy issue.</p> <p>Can you please speak to your child about this message. <p>2nd November 2025</p>	<p>Good afternoon,</p> <p>We look forward to welcoming all our students back to school on Monday 3rd November. Please support your child by ensuring that they arrive on time, in full school uniform including no make up, false eyelashes or false nails and natural hair colour. Can we also please have your support in ensuring that students are in front of the teachers as often as possible and as such use the toilets before school, break, lunch and after school unless they have a medical condition. Students will never be stopped from using the toilet, however, the disruption this causes to students learning, including the rest of the class as students leave the room effects the progress that they are making. 10 minutes of missed learning per day is the equivalent to missing over 35 hours of teaching in a year.</p> <p>Thank you for your continued support.</p> <p>Mr McKendrick</p>
<p>10th September 2025</p>	<p>Good morning,</p> <p>I am a firm believer that that our school will continue to improve through a collaborative approach with staff, students, and parents/carers. I have received some parental feedback regarding the email that is sent with the intention to support your understanding of when your child is missing learning due to going to the toilet. As mentioned, this was designed to support both medical needs and missed learning. Following the feedback we have made the decision to stop the email being sent out to you while still logging toilet use on Arbor. This way, you can still keep an eye on your child's activity in school and support them where needed. Good afternoon,

We have had a lovely start back to the year for all students today. This included assemblies regarding our expectations, and, importantly, attendance to school. Students in Hawkley Hall High School with more than 90% attendance achieve on average one grade more in all their subjects, than students with less than 90%. Attendance means being in front of the teachers. Please ensure that you support your child to attend school everyday on time in full school uniform.

As mentioned in my letter prior to summer, if your child needs to miss their learning by leaving the classroom during lesson to use the toilet, we will send you an email to let you know. My hope is that this will support any students who have a medical pass with their next medical review, and an students without a medical pass with their attendance in lessons. Thank you for continuing to support our school by asking your child, where possible, to use the toilet before school, break, lunch or after school. Again, students will not be stopped from going to the toilet during lessons.

Finally, our open evening for primary students takes place next Wednesday from 5.30pm until 7.30 pm.
